The plans

Rother District Council has published its plans for the new housing sites in Burwash. Before the Council decides, it will hold a consultation exercise lasting 8 weeks. The consultation will start sometime after the 15 January 2026.

There are six proposed sites. Four of them are in Shrub Lane and two of them are in Burwash Common.

Burwash: Save our Fields is hosting an event in the Bear public house in the High Street on Saturday 10 January 2025 at 11 am to publicise the proposals and help people understand them.

The plans are based on the need for the following new homes.
